The meeting was called to order at 4:00 p.m.

Pledge of Allegiance.

Commissioner Hosey made a motion to accept the minutes of the January 8, 2014 meeting. Commissioner Austin seconded.

LIMITED PUBLIC COMMENT

CENTRAL DISPATCH UPDATE

Director Heinze updated the Committee on the findings and recommendation resulting from the LEIN Audit Report at Central Dispatch. It was reported that a corrective action plan is being prepared and will be submitted as required. Director Sobie advised that his department is working with Central Dispatch as well as other county offices that have LEIN access to address the identified technical issues.

SHERIFF'S OFFICE UPDATE

Undersheriff Cook advised that the information for the significant cases for January was not available for this meeting and will report next month. Commissioner Whittum requested the total number of calls for service by the Sheriff's Office. Undersheriff Cook will report back next month with comparisons for past years. Controller Fuentes advised the Committee that those stats are also available in the Sheriff's Office Annual Report.

MONTHLY REPORTS

Controller Fuentes distributed and reviewed the boarding/revenue report and provided information regarding the state reimbursement programs included in the report.

Court Security and Jail Census report were also distributed and received.

CENTRAL DISPATCH/JAIL TOURS

Commissioner Whittum requested that the tours be arraigned for next month's meeting.

MISCELLANEOUS

Commissioner Spence requested information on how Eaton County handles forfeiture issues since there were recently announced changes regarding federal civil forfeitures. He inquired as to the level of forfeiture activity and adverse impact on revenues for the County, if the Sheriff's Office is utilizing these funds as part of its budget. Undersheriff Cook explained the proceedings under the law used by Eaton County for items and cash seized under forfeiture, indicated the civil forfeiture proceedings typically result from a criminal investigation and that the department does not rely on these revenues to support its ongoing operations. Chief Deputy Warder reported that \$600 was obtained by forfeiture in 2014 although the amounts would vary from year to year.

Discussion was held on criminal and civil forfeitures.

Prosecutor Lloyd explained how the investigation determines how the evidence and forfeiture is handled. He further advised that forfeitures are taken seriously and are at a higher standard for prosecution. Eaton County does not rely on forfeiture revenue to support its operations.

Commissioner Spence also brought the policy on body worn cameras up for discussion. Undersheriff advised that there is a policy that has been developed and is being put into use and that the officers are being trained to use the cameras under the policy. Undersheriff Cook indicated that the policy may be revised in the future based on court decisions related to the use of this evolving technology.

Commissioner Whittum advised the Committee of two issues with hand held radios and an issue with fire tones that is being handled by Central Dispatch.


Undersheriff Cook advised there was a Court Security meeting with the Judges and it was very productive. Discussion is being held on security in the courthouse
