The meeting was called to order at 4:00 p.m.

Pledge of Allegiance.

Commissioner Rogers made a motion to accept the minutes of the January 7, 2016 meeting. Commissioner Hosey seconded.

LIMITED PUBLIC COMMENT

Tony Sands from Countryside Towing advised that the towing company is now an AAA Preferred Provider.

SHERIFF'S OFFICE UPDATE

Undersheriff Cook provided an update on recent case activity.
Discussion held on upcoming training for road patrol.

MONTHLY REPORTS

REIMBURSEMENT

Controller Fuentes noted that there is a projected reduction in MDOC housing revenues which is being monitored to determine if the trend will continue.

JAIL CENSUS

Controller Fuentes advised reported that the jail census has yet to increase since the authorization of the agreement with Statewide Transport for inmate boarding last month.

COURT SECURITY

Controller Fuentes reported reviewed the Courthouse Security report.

CENTRAL DISPATCH UPDATE

Controller Fuentes updated the Committee on a legal matter that involves Central Dispatch, Benton Township, Potterville Schools and the City of Potterville. He asked the Committee for authorization for Mr. Doug Van Essen to represent the County in this matter. Discussion held.

Commissioner Hosey made a motion to authorize the Controller to contact Mr. Van Essen to seek for legal representation of the County. Commissioner Austin seconded the motion.

Motion carried.

Director Heinze updated the Committee on the impairment of Dispatch service in December as a result of underground work being performed in the County Complex. Procedure was followed with Ingham County receiving any 911 calls during the time the lines were down for repairs to be made, which was less than a minute.

Commissioner Whittum asked that the Board of Commissioners be contacted if a situation causing an interruption or outage of 9-1-1 service occurs in the future.

MISCELLANEOUS

Discussion held on a pilot program in two counties to provide tablets for inmates. Commissioner Spence shared information that he received through the Michigan Association of Counties Public Safety Committee. Background has been given to the Sheriff to review and the Sheriff's Office has started reviewing the pilot program to determine if it is a project the Sheriff would present for consideration.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Mike Atayan from Davis Auto Mart advised that his business has acquired heavier duty tow trucks. Mr. Atayan requested to be included in the bidding process for body shop work, towing and routine maintenance of for county vehicles. He also advised that his business is recognized by AAA in certain areas and as a secondary towing option. Controller Fuentes advised that the County does not enter into a contract for the towing of county-owned vehicles, services are acquired on an as needed basis.

Commissioner Spence updated the Committee on information he received regarding suicide interventions in Delta Township.

Discussion was held on the Mall Security policy that is under development which would require anyone less than 16 years of age to have an adult accompany them after 6 p.m.

Commissioner Spence also advised that the Delta Expo will be held on Saturday, March 5, 2015 at the Lansing Mall from 10 a.m. until 3 p.m.

Commissioner Rogers made a motion to adjourn. Commissioner Austin seconded the motion.
Motion carried.
