

EATON COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS
SEPTEMBER 12, 2006

The Eaton County Board of Commissioners met in regular session at the County Facilities, in the City of Charlotte on Tuesday, September 12, 2006.

Chairman Peters called the meeting to order at 6:30 P.M.

The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag was given by all.

Invocation was given by Commissioner MacDowell.

Chairman Peters asked for changes to the agenda. Hearing none, the agenda stood as presented.

Commissioner Johnson, Chairperson of the Finance Committee read the Annual Budget Report to the Board. He noted the total proposed 2006/2007 Budget for Eaton County is \$31,794,170 and highlighted specific areas of both revenues and expenses.

Chairman Peters asked for comments from the Board. There were none.

There was no Unfinished Business or New Business.

Chairman Peters opened the Public Hearing for Truth in Budgeting at 6:40 PM. The purpose of the Public Hearing is to receive testimony and discuss the proposed 2006/2007 Budget and millage rates for Eaton County. The proposed millage rates are as follows: General County Operation – 5.2149 mills, County Jail Debt and Operation– .9478 of a mill, 911 Emergency Service – .9438 of a mill, Juvenile Justice - .3973 of a mill and EATRAN – .2469 of a mill for a total of 7.7507 mills.

Chairman Peters asked for public comment.

Hearing none, the Public Hearing was closed as 6:45 PM.

Chairman Peters announced the Board of Commissioners will meet on Wednesday, September 20, 2006 at 9:00 A.M. to adopt the 2006/2007 Budget and Millage Rates.

Commissioner Farhat moved the meeting recess to Wednesday, September 20, 2006 at 9:00 A.M. Supported by Commissioner Kellermann. Carried.
