APRIL 16, 2008

The Eaton County Board of Commissioners met in regular session at the County Facilities, in the City of Charlotte, Wednesday, April 16, 2008.

Chairman Brehler called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM.

The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag was given by all.

Chairperson Brehler announced Al Starr a former member of the Board of Supervisors, Board of Commissioners and County Treasurer passed away April 15, 2008.

Commissioner MacDowell gave the invocation.

Commissioner Peters deleted item #2 under the Ways and Means Committee Report and added Amendment to the County Clerk's Fee Schedule in its place. Agenda stood as amended.

Commissioner Baker moved the minutes of March 19, 2008 be approved as presented. Seconded by Commissioner Luna. Carried.

Commissioner Pearl-Wright moved the approval of Resolution #08-4-34, To Revise the Inter County Agreement for the Creation of the Mid-South Substance Abuse Commission by removing Calhoun County per their request. Seconded by Commissioner Farhat. Carried.

Commissioner Pearl-Wright moved the approval of Resolution #08-4-35, Requesting Sparrow Hospital reconsider their decision to eliminate the Behavioral Health Services Program. Seconded by Commissioner Clarke. Carried.

Commissioner Pearl-Wright moved the approval of Resolution #08-4-36, Proclaiming April 2008 as Alcohol Awareness Month in Eaton County. Seconded by Commissioner Hosey. Carried.

Commissioner Pearl-Wright moved the approval of Resolution #08-4-37, Supporting the National Association of Counties Campaign Against Sexual Exploitation. Seconded by Commissioner Forell. Carried.

Commissioner Pearl-Wright moved the approval of Resolution #08-4-38, Supporting H.R. 5613 on Regulations Issued by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services, placing a moratorium on all of the pending Medicaid rules until March 31, 2009. Seconded by Commissioner Freeman. Carried.

Commissioner Freeman formed a task force consisting of Commissioners Abed, Clarke, Hosey, Keefe and Strachan, Animal Control Director Larry Green, Steve Heaven of the Capital Area Humane Society, and Judy Oisten to review the operations of the Animal Control Department and make recommendations on areas of concern.

New Business.


1/ Commissioners are invited to the Fox Park Improvement Opening Ceremonies on May 20, 2008 at 6:30 PM.



**RESOLUTION TO REVISE THE INTER COUNTY AGREEMENT
FOR THE CREATION OF THE MID-SOUTH SUBSTANCE ABUSE COMMISSION**

Introduced by the Health and Human Services Committee

Commissioner Pearl-Wright moved the approval of the following resolution.
Seconded by Commissioner Farhat.

WHEREAS, the Mid-South Substance Abuse Commission entered into an Agreement on the 18th day of December 1996, between the Counties of Calhoun, Clinton, Eaton, Gratiot, Hillsdale, Ingham, Jackson, Lenawee and Shiawassee, and amended effective in 2004 to add Ionia and Newaygo Counties, and remove Shiawassee County; and

WHEREAS, an amendment to this Agreement may be proposed in writing by the Commission; and

WHEREAS, this Agreement may be amended only by the mutual agreement of the contracting Counties pursuant to resolution authorized by each of the County Board of Commissioners and entered into in writing; and

WHEREAS, any of the parties to the Agreement may withdraw from participation in the Commission upon giving ninety (90) days prior notice to the other participating units; and

WHEREAS, Calhoun County has provided such notice to the other participating units; and

WHEREAS, the remaining governmental units shall, by mutual agreement, determine the number and distribution of members of the Commission and Advisory Council, and shall execute an amendment to this Agreement reflecting such agreement, which includes the following:

The membership of the Commission and the Advisory Council shall remain unchanged except for the elimination of three (3) members appointed to the Commission by the Board of Commissioners of the County of Calhoun and member appointed to the Advisory Council by the Board of Commissioners of the County of Calhoun.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Intercounty Agreement for the creation of the Mid-South Substance Abuse Commission shall be amended to include the counties of Clinton, Eaton, Gratiot, Hillsdale, Ionia, Ingham, Jackson, Newaygo, and Lenawee Counties, and that the number and distribution of members of the Commission shall reflect the membership of the Commission and the Advisory Council shall remain unchanged except for the elimination of three (3) members appointed to the Commission by the Board of Commissioners of the County of Calhoun and the member appointed to the Advisory Council by the Board of Commissioners of the County of Calhoun.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Eaton County Board of Commissioners authorizes the Board Chair and County Clerk to sign any and all amendment agreements consistent with this resolution.

**RESOLUTION REGARDING ELIMINATION OF
SPARROW BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES**

Introduced by the Health and Human Services Committee

Commissioner Pearl-Wright moved the approval of the following resolution.
Seconded by Commissioner Clarke.

WHEREAS, Sparrow Hospital proposes to eliminate the Behavioral Health Services program provided at its St. Lawrence Campus on May 9, 2008; and

WHEREAS, for years the Behavioral Health Services program has provided much needed mental health services to high risk clients with insurance; and

WHEREAS, the Community Mental Health (CMH) system is not a suitable alternative for the patients, including those who are high risk, who seek treatment at the St. Lawrence campus because the CMH system is already at capacity and places its priority on treatment of the seriously mentally ill, rather than high risk patients, and on those clients without insurance; and

WHEREAS, the unique services provision model of the Behavioral Health Services program at the St. Lawrence Campus facilitates immediate mental health assessments and rapid and seamless access to, and integration of, emergency room services, psychiatric and social work services, the in-patient geriatric program, backup support services, and other medical and mental health services; and

WHEREAS, the elimination of the program would make it very difficult for patients to receive mental health services since many private practitioners have waiting lists for new clients and hesitate to accept patients with insurance because of the low reimbursement rates of many policies and the myriad obstacles to processing claims; and

WHEREAS, these intervention programs provide long term cost savings for communities.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Eaton County Board of Commissioners, respectfully requests Sparrow Hospital to reconsider its decision to eliminate the Behavioral Health Services program. Carried.

RESOLUTION PROCLAIMING APRIL 2008
AS ALCOHOL AWARENESS MONTH IN EATON COUNTY**

Introduced by the Health and Human Services Committee

Commissioner Pearl-Wright moved the approval of the following resolution.
Seconded by Commissioner Hosey.

WHEREAS, Alcohol Awareness Month is a national effort through the National Council on Alcoholism and Drug Dependence to support research, education, intervention and treatment for alcoholism and alcohol related problems; and

WHEREAS, the results of the 2006 Prevention Needs Assessment Survey of 2,227 Eaton County youth show 65.4% of 10th graders and 75.8% of 12th graders have used alcohol; and

WHEREAS, the results of the 2006 Prevention Needs Assessment Survey of 2,227 Eaton County youth show 46.6% of 12th graders have used alcohol in the past 30 days; and

WHEREAS, alcohol is a factor in the four leading causes of death among persons ages 10-24: motor-vehicle crashes, unintentional injuries, homicide and suicide; and

WHEREAS, the same 2006 Prevention Needs Assessment Survey shows that Eaton County young people begin drinking, on average at 14 years of age; and

WHEREAS, young people who begin drinking before age 15 are four times more likely to develop alcohol dependence than those who begin drinking at age 21; and

WHEREAS, alcohol abuse is linked to as many as two-thirds of all sexual assaults, date rapes of teens and college students and is a major factor in unprotected sex among youth, increasing their risk of contracting HIV or other sexually transmitted diseases.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that:

1. The Eaton County Board of Commissioners hereby proclaims April 2008 as Alcohol Awareness Month in Eaton County.
2. The Eaton County Board of Commissioners call upon all citizens, parents, youth, governmental agencies, public and private institutions, businesses and workplaces, hospitals, and schools in Eaton County to support Eaton County Substance Abuse Advisory Group initiatives and other local efforts to reduce and prevent underage drinking in our communities.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Clerk of the Board of Commissioners is requested to forward copies of this adopted resolution to the Eaton County Substance Abuse Advisory Group in support of their effort to reduce and prevent underage drinking throughout Eaton County.

WHEREAS, according to the U.S. Department of Justice, in a one-year period, an estimated 1.6 million children either ran away from or were thrown out of their homes; and

WHEREAS, an estimated 40,000 of these children will be involved in some form of sexual exploitation and victimized by predators; and

WHEREAS, housing instability, poverty, untreated psychological and emotional problems, substance abuse, educational and vocational failure and major problems at home have all been cited as common precipitating factors in the lives of exploited children; and

WHEREAS, the National Association of Counties' (NACo) and the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children (NCMEC) have partnered for a national campaign to promote child safety and help prevent the commercial child sexual exploitation.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED; that the Eaton County Board of Commissioners hereby supports the National Association of Counties' (NACo) and the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children (NCMEC) campaign dedicated to preventing commercial child sexual exploitation; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Clerk of the Board of Commissioners is requested to forward copies of this adopted resolution to the National Association of Counties, the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children and the Michigan Association of Counties. Carried.

**RESOLUTION SUPPORTING H.R. 5613 ON REGULATIONS ISSUED
BY THE CENTERS FOR MEDICARE AND MEDICAID SERVICES**

WHEREAS, since March 2007, the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services issued ten proposed rules that would fundamentally alter the financing and administration of the Medicaid program and would undermine the federal-state Medicaid partnership by significantly reducing payments and shifting the cost of maintaining services to state and local governments; and

WHEREAS, on March 3, 2008 the National Association of Counties Board of Directors opposed the proposed rules that would place severe restrictions on the ability of state and county governments to finance the Medicaid program and provide Medicaid Services. NACo further opposed any additional regulations which will reduce federal payment and/or shift costs to local safety net providers. NACo urged Congress stop the rules' implementation by extending and/or creating moratoriums through April 2009 for CMS regulations including, but not limited to: Rehabilitation Services Option, Graduate Medical Education, Public Provider Cost Limit, School Based Administration and Transportation, Outpatient Clinic and Hospital Facility Services and Targeted Case Management; and

WHEREAS, Congressman John Dingell has cosponsored H.R. 5613, a bill to place a moratorium on all of the pending Medicaid rules until March 31, 2009.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED; that the Eaton County Board of Commissioners hereby supports H.R. 5613 placing a moratorium on all of the pending Medicaid rules until March 31, 2009.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Clerk of the Board of Commissioners is requested to forward copies of this adopted resolution to the National Association of Counties, Governor Jennifer Granholm, U.S. Representative Walberg, U.S. Representative John Dingell, U.S. Senator Stabenow and U.S. Senator Levin. Carried.
