

EATON COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

APRIL 21, 2010

The Eaton County Board of Commissioners met in regular session at the County Facilities, in the City of Charlotte, Wednesday, April 21, 2010.

Chairman Brehler called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM.

The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag was given by all.

Commissioner Clarke gave the invocation.

Roll call. Commissioners present; Michael Hosey, Blake Mulder, Theresa Abed, Carol Strachan, Jeanne Pearl-Wright, Leo Farhat, Glenn Freeman, Linda Keefe, Art Luna, Daryl Baker, Dale Barr, Denise Clarke, Roger Harris, Joseph Brehler. Commissioners absent; John Forell.

Commissioner Keefe removed item #6, 2009/2010 General Fund Budget Amendments from the Ways and Means Committee report. Chairman Brehler added a resolution in memory of Donald E. Rice.

Commissioner Barr moved the agenda be approved as amended. Seconded by Commissioner Farhat. Carried.

Commissioner Baker moved the minutes of March 17, 2010 be approved as presented. Seconded by Commissioner Luna. Carried.

Public Comment.

Larry McNair, 2500 S. Cochran, Countryside Towing spoke about a proposed recommendation to discontinue the County's no preference wrecker/towing policy.

Jeff Lutz, 4623 Thornton Hwy, Charlotte also spoke about the proposed amendments to the no preference wrecker/towing policy.

Howard Pizzo, Delta Township Treasurer reported Delta Township has studied and supports the proposed EATRAN millage proposal.

Mike Atayan, 7147 Steeplechase Way, Delta Township spoke against the proposed wrecker/towing policy change.

Public Hearing. Chairman Brehler called the public hearing to order at 7:20 PM. Claudine Hannold, Community Development Director reported the purpose of the public hearing is to gain citizen input prior to the submission of the Eaton County Community Development and Housing Department's grant application to the Michigan State Housing Development Authority for Community Development Block Grant Funding.

Chairman Brehler asked for Commissioner comment. Commissioner Freeman asked how a homeowner pays back the loan. Ms. Hannold reported a lien is placed on the property and it is paid back similar to a mortgage. Commissioner Pearl-Wright inquired what 80% of medium income in

Eaton County is. Ms. Hannold reported there is a scale indicating when a person is eligible based on their income level. Commissioner Mulder asked how many residents have been helped under the current grant and Ms. Hannold reported 18 Eaton County residents have been helped. Commissioner Strachan inquired how people know of the grant. Ms. Hannold reported her office receives referrals from CACS and Housing Services, newspaper promotions and word of mouth.

Chairman Brehler asked for public comment. There was no public comment.
The public hearing was closed at 7:30 PM.

Chairman Brehler moved the adoption of Resolution #10-4-36 in Memory of Donald E. Rice and in Appreciation for the Blue Light Players Performance Dedicated to His Memory. The Blue Light and Light Blue Players perform locally to honor the memory of officers who have lost their lives in the line of duty and raise money for the families. Seconded by Commissioner Freeman. Carried unanimously.

Captain Jeff Warder thanked the Board on behalf of the Sheriff for adopting the resolution and invited the Board to the performance on Friday night.

Commissioner Pearl-Wright moved the approval of Resolution #10-4-37, Urging Implementation of the State Substance Abuse Treatment and Prevention Allocation Formula as recommended by the Advisory Formula Allocation Workgroup in August of 2005. Seconded by Commissioner Barr. Carried.

Commissioner Pearl-Wright announced ground breaking ceremonies were held earlier today for the dental clinic which will open this fall.

Commissioner Freeman moved the approval of Resolution #10-4-38, Declaring April 18-24, 2010 as National Crime Victims Rights Week in Eaton County and supporting this year's theme "Crime Victims' Rights: Fairness, Dignity, Respect." Seconded by Commissioner Keefe. Carried.

Commissioner Freeman moved the approval of Resolution #10-4-39, Declaring April 11-17, 2010 as National Public Safety Telecommunications Week in Eaton County in honor of the men and women whose diligence and professionalism keep our County and citizens safe. Seconded by Commissioner Farhat. Carried.

Chairman Brehler referred concerns regarding the County's wrecker/towing policy to the Public Safety Committee and the Director of 911.

Commissioner Abed reported the Citizens University 3 day program has been canceled due to low enrollment. A 1 day fall program is being considered.

Commissioner Luna moved JoeAnn Nehmer be appointed to the Eaton County Transportation Authority for the remainder of an unexpired term expiring 12-31-2012, representing the NW quadrant of the County. Seconded by Commissioner Hosey. Carried.

Commissioner Luna moved the approval of Resolution #10-4-40 to Apply for a Michigan Community Development Block Grant in an amount up to \$300,000. Seconded by Commissioner Farhat. Carried.

Commissioner Luna moved the approval of Resolution #10-4-41 to Adopt Eaton County Housing Department Targeted Homeowner Rehabilitation Program Guidelines which comply with all appropriate state and federal legislation and requirements. Seconded by Commissioner Baker. Carried.

Commissioner Luna moved the approval of a Resolution supporting the 2010-2013 Revised Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy for the Tri-County Region of Eaton, Clinton and Ingham Counties. Seconded by Commissioner Strachan.

Commissioner Freeman moved to table the resolution until a final document is available. The present document is still in draft form. Seconded by Commissioner Farhat. Carried.

Commissioner Luna moved the approval of Resolution #10-4-42 Proclaiming April 28, 2010 as Worker's Memorial Day in recognition of workers killed, injured and disabled on the job. Seconded by Commissioner Pearl-Wright. Carried.

Commissioner Keefe moved the approval of Document #10-4-43 Adopting the 2010 Equalization Report for Eaton County. Seconded by Commissioner Barr. Carried.

Commissioner Keefe moved the approval of Resolution #10-4-44 To Approve Title IV-D Cooperative Reimbursement applications for the Friend of the Court in the amount of \$1,664,200 and Prosecuting Attorney in the amount of \$153,700. Seconded by Commissioner Clarke. Carried.

Commissioner Keefe moved the approval of Resolution #10-4-45 to Approve a Grant Application for the Qualified Voter File's Electronic Poll Book project. Seconded by Commissioner Farhat. Carried.

Commissioner Keefe moved the approval of Resolution #10-4-46 To Establish a County Clerk Petty Cash Fund in the amount of \$200. Seconded by Commissioner Baker. Carried.

Commissioner Keefe moved the approval of Resolution #10-4-47 To Submit to a Vote of the electorate an EATRAN Millage authorization request in an amount not to exceed 0.7500 of a mill for the August 3, 2010 ballot. Seconded by Commissioner Baker.

Commissioner Mulder indicated he will vote no, feeling it is the wrong time to ask voters to increase the current millage. Commissioner Strachan stated she will support the increase and allow the voters to decide whether to support the millage. Commissioner Pearl-Wright will support the resolution and requested support of the board. One of the reasons the increase is needed is because of the reduced hours instituted by EATRAN due to funding issues. Chairman Brehler indicated he has had many conversations with members of the community regarding the transportation needs of the county and congratulated the EATRAN Board for their forward thinking in expanding the roll of EATRAN in the county.

Commissioner Keefe moved the approval of Resolution #10-4-48, to Approve 2009/2010 Special Fund Budget Amendments. Seconded by Commissioner Freeman. Carried.

Commissioner Keefe moved the approval of claims as audited by the Ways and Means Committee in the amount of \$480,129.44 and to accept the report of previously authorized payments. Seconded by Commissioner Pearl-Wright. Carried.

There was no Public comment.

Commissioner comment. Commissioner Pearl-Wright reminded the Board it is County Government Month and noted the displays in the lobby of the Courthouse. Commissioner's Mulder and Pearl-Wright are hosting a Southern Michigan Area Region Three (SMART) meeting at 10AM on June 2nd with a tour of Liquid Web. Commissioner Hosey reminded Commissioners of the Vermontville Maple Syrup Festival this weekend. Commissioner Mulder, urged Commissioners to support a project to create a Vietnam Memorial in Grand Ledge. Commissioner Freeman reported there will be a presentation on May 10th with Ingham County and the City of Lansing in honor of Workers Month.

There was no Unfinished Business, Old Business or New Business.

**RESOLUTION URGING IMPLEMENTATION OF THE
STATE SUBSTANCE ABUSE TREATMENT AND
PREVENTION ALLOCATION FORMULA**

Introduced by the Health and Human Services Committee

Commissioner Pearl-Wright moved the approval of the following resolution.
Seconded by Commissioner Barr.

WHEREAS, the Michigan Public Health Code, Article 6, Part 62, Section 6211, directs the Office of Substance Abuse Services...“to recommend to the governor and legislature criteria for a formula basis for the distribution of substance abuse state and federal funds for substance abuse treatment and prevention, and

WHEREAS, a 2005 Performance Audit of the Bureau of Substance Abuse and Addiction Services recommended that “...BSAAS review its methodology for allocating funds to its regional CAs to help insure that funding for substance abuse prevention and treatment services is based on the needs for those services in each region.”, and

WHEREAS, BSAAS agreed with the audit finding and convened and facilitated an Advisory Formula Allocation Workgroup, and

WHEREAS, the Advisory Formula Allocation Workgroup recommended an allocation formula to BSAAS in August of 2005 that has not been implemented, and

WHEREAS, the Mid-South Substance Abuse Commission is the Regional Coordinating Agency for the counties of Clinton, Eaton, Gratiot, Hillsdale, Ingham, Ionia, Jackson, Lenawee, Newaygo, and

WHEREAS, the annual allocation of funds by BSAAS to Mid-South Substance Abuse Commission is nearly \$1.2 million less than determined by the formula developed by the Advisory Formula Allocation Workgroup, and

WHEREAS, the lost funding causes reduced services for the residents of the nine (9) counties served by Mid-South Substance Abuse Commission, and

WHEREAS, the funding inequity results in disproportionate human and financial costs within the referenced counties, including increased medical, law enforcement, judicial, and other costs.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Eaton County Board of Commissioners urges the Michigan Department of Community Health Bureau of Substance Abuse and Addiction Services to immediately begin the implementation of the allocation formula as recommended by the Advisory Formula Allocation Workgroup in August of 2005; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this resolution be transmitted to the Michigan Department of Community Health Bureau of Substance Abuse and Addiction Services, the Director of the Michigan Department of Community Health, Representatives and Senators elected to serve our county residents, the Chairs of the Senate and House Appropriations Committees for the Department of Community Health, the County Board of Commissioners for each of the nine counties served by the Mid-South Substance Abuse Commission, the Michigan Association of Counties (MAC), and to the Mid-South Substance Abuse Commission.

Allocation of State and Federal Substance Abuse Funds**

The formula recommended in August of 2005 by the Allocation Formula Workgroup convened and facilitated by the Michigan Department of Community Health's Bureau of Substance Abuse and Addiction Services is:

$$\text{Allocation} = ((A/B) * 0.75) + (X/Z) * 0.25 * Q$$

A = Number of residents of Coordinating Agency region living at or below 150% of poverty

B = Number of residents of the State of Michigan living at or below 150% of poverty

X = Number of residents of the Coordinating Agency region classified as "unemployed"

Z = Number of residents of the State of Michigan classified as "unemployed"

Q = Total funds available for allocation

Subject: Recommendation for the Adoption of the 2010 Equalization Report

The assessment rolls for all units have been received and reviewed by the Equalization Department.

Meetings with the Ways & Means Committee and assessing officers were held in December of 2009 to resolve any problems regarding the changes in value.

The 2009 Equalization Studies indicated a 8.1% **decrease** in the value of existing properties, not including new construction. The total **decrease** in equalized value from 2009 to 2010 including new construction is 7.37%. The valuations contained in this report are required to be at between 49%-50% of the true cash value. The traditional assessment and equalization process remains the same in order that requirements of the Michigan Constitution are met.

The Michigan voters approved Proposal A on March 5, 1994. Public Act 415 of 1994 contains many changes to the General Property Tax Laws regarding the implementation of Proposal A. The most significant change deals with the relationship of the state equalized value and taxable value. Taxable value replaces state equalized value for the levy of property taxes beginning in 1995. It is the taxable value, not the assessed/equalized value that is subject to the capped limitation. Therefore, the 2009 taxable value can only **decrease** by the inflation rate (0.7%) to determine the 2010 taxable value for each property (unless you purchased property in 2009). The total taxable value of Eaton County is not available at this time.

I hope the enclosed information will assist you in the adoption of the 2010 Equalization Report. The state required form L-4024 is enclosed as well.

**EATON COUNTY TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY (EATRAN)
MILLAGE AUTHORIZATION QUESTION**

For the purpose of providing funds for the exclusive use of public transportation purposes, to include accommodation for the elderly and handicapped, by the Eaton County Transportation Authority (EATRAN); shall the tax limitation and levy imposed under the Michigan Constitution by the County of Eaton be increased in an amount not to exceed 0.7500 of a mill (\$0.7500 on each \$1,000 dollars of taxable value) against all taxable real and tangible personal property within the County of Eaton for a period of five (5) years, 2012 to 2016, inclusive, and shall the County of Eaton levy such millage for said purposes? The estimate of the revenue for the County of Eaton in the 2012 calendar year is approximately \$2,554,672. A small portion of the revenue collected (approximately \$38,576 in 2012) may be required to be distributed to Downtown Development Authorities, Tax Increment Financing Authorities, Local Development Financing Authorities and Brownfield Redevelopment Financing Authorities established in cities of Charlotte, Eaton Rapids, Grand Ledge, Potterville and Olivet.
