The meeting was called to order at 4:00 p.m.

Pledge of Allegiance given by all.

Commissioner Ridge made a motion to accept the December 1, 2011 minutes as recorded. Commissioner Whittum seconded. MOTION CARRIED.

**LIMITED PUBLIC COMMENT**

Helen Schneider discussed her concerns regarding the Animal Control Ordinance. She requested postponing the vote on the ordinance until the February meeting. Commissioner Boles advised that Ms. Schneider can address her concerns at the January Board of Commissioners meeting.

**REIMBURSEMENT REPORT/BOARDING UPDATE** – Chief Deputy Peacock

Chief Deputy Peacock discussed the November 2011 Boarding Report. He advised that the report indicates preliminary revenues of \$388,500 for the Parole Violators program and \$210,000 for the Diverted Felons program.

The average daily population for the month of December was 216 including an average of 27 from MDOC.

Chief Deputy Peacock discussed the Sheriff's Office response time stats for December 2011. He advised that a special software program is needed in order to separate the stats for County and Delta. He stated that a custom report can be developed to obtain the data. Due to this information, Commissioner Boles requested a report of random sample of calls for County Road Patrol for a future meeting.

**DEPARTMENT UPDATE** – Undersheriff Fred McPhail

Undersheriff McPhail discussed the recent B & E's in the County.

Undersheriff McPhail advised that a news conference was held on December 22<sup>nd</sup> at the Sheriff's Office regarding the Greene homicide and the arrest of Christopher Perrien. Discussion ensued regarding the issue of court-ordered work release.

**HAZARDOUS MATERIALS PREPAREDNESS GRANT** – Sgt. Aaron Brown

Sgt. Brown requested the approval of the Committee to apply for the Hazardous Material Emergency Preparedness Grant. Commissioner Boles requested a date change on the resolution from January 12, 2012 to January 18, 2012. Commissioner Whittum made a motion to forward the resolution to the Full Board. Commissioner Hosey seconded. MOTION CARRIED.

**MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES CONTRACT** – Controller John Fuentes

Controller Fuentes advised that he will not be able to provide a proposed contract renewal at this time as it was not provided by Community Mental Health yet. It is anticipated to be available for the next regular meeting. He advised that there will be no gap of service and a continuation of service to the Jail.

**RESOLUTION TO APPROVE HAZARDOUS MATERIAL EMERGENCY  
PREPAREDNESS GRANT APPLICATION**

**Introduced by the Public Safety Committee**

**WHEREAS**, the Michigan State Police Emergency Management and Homeland Security Division has grant funds available through the U.S. Department of Homeland Security; and

**WHEREAS**, the Eaton County Local Emergency Planning Committee is requesting Eaton County to sponsor the grant application; and

**WHEREAS**, the grant will provide funding for the completion of Superfund Amendments and Reauthorization Act (SARA) Title III, Section 302, off-site response plans and support of the ongoing operation of Local Emergency Planning Commissions (LEPC) at a rate of \$250 for new plans and \$30 for updated plans to be provided through a contract with the Regional Planner and \$1,000 for the support of the LEPC eligible support expenses; and

**WHEREAS**, there is a 20% in-kind match which will be met by the LEPC member time and office and administrative expenses.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Board of Commissioners approves Eaton County's application for participation in the Hazardous Materials Emergency Preparedness Grant; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Controller be authorized to approve any necessary budget amendments to increase expenditures and increase grant revenue if the grant is approved by the State of Michigan; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Chairperson or his designee is authorized to sign any necessary documents pertaining to the County's participation.
