EATON COUNTY PARK'S COMMUNITY GRANT PROGRAM

The Eaton County Parks and Recreation Millage was passed by voters on November 8, 2022. A portion of these funds have been set aside for the development of a competitive grant program for communities within Eaton County. This competitive grant program will support acquisition, improvements, and/or development. The County wishes to acknowledge the hard work of the Parks and Recreation workgroup, which is made up of Eaton County Board of Commissioner members and County staff. In light of these efforts, the County is pleased to announce

a new competitive grant program—Eaton County Parks Community Grant Program—which is now up and running and accepting applications through Friday, July 28, 2023 at 5:00 PM (EST). The Eaton County Parks Community Grant Program was created to assist local communities with planning, purchasing, preliminary engineering/design, and construction costs directly related to parks and open space projects located in the County. Beginning October 1st, 2023 our first round of funding will be \$400,000.

Every year, there are hundreds of hunting accidents in the United States. Most of these accidents can be prevented by following basic safety rules.

Here are some important hunter safety tips:

- Always wear hunter orange or other bright clothing when you are hunting.
- Always identify your target before you shoot. Make sure that you are only shooting at the animal that you are hunting.

- Never shoot at sound or movement. Assume that anything that you hear or see is another hunter until you can clearly identify it.
- Tell someone where you will be hunting and when you will return.
